## HPM022I HORTICULTURE & PLANT MANAGEMENT

**(CREDITS: 03)** 

**Objectives:** To make students understand the importance, cultivation and propagation of horticultural crops.

#### UNIT-I: FUNDAMENTALS OF HORTICULTURE

- Introduction and scope of horticulture in J&K.
- An overview of Horticulture crops of J&K (vegetable crops, fruit crops, ornamentals, medicinal &aromatic plants).
- Area, production and productivity of major horticulture crops in J&K.
- Concept of orchards, home gardens, floating gardens, and kitchen gardens for growing fruit and vegetable crops.
- Types of crops suitable for cultivation under poly-green houses.
- Plant propagation techniques brief account of vegetative and sexual propagation.

#### **UNIT-II: PLANT MANAGEMENT**

- Brief account of propagation techniques with special reference to vegetable and fruit crops.
- Soil fertility and factors affecting soil fertility, fertilizer types and management for crop growth and yield. Types of irrigation facilities (Canal irrigation, Drip irrigation, sprinkler irrigation).
- Essential micro and macro elements that affect crop growth and yield. .
- Nutritional properties of important vegetable crops, importance of vegetables in human nutrition.
- Post-harvest management practices in major fruit and vegetable crops (grading, packaging and storage).

## UNIT-III: CULTIVATION AND VALUE ADDITION

- Scope of cultivation of medicinal and ornamental plants. Advantages and constraints.
- Plant part used, medicinal properties of some medicinal plants of Kashmir (*Atropa acuminate*, *Artemesia absenthium*, *Sassurea lappa*).
- Commercial floriculture in J&K, concept and scope of cut flower technology, post-harvest management of cut flowers (examples- rose, marigold, chrysanthemum, tulip, gladiolus, and other locally important ornamentals).
- Value addition in important fruit and vegetable crops of J&K (preparation of Juices, Jams, jelleys, pickles, sauces etc.)
- Economic potential and employment opportunities in horticulture sector of J&K.
