HST122J: HISTORY (ANCIENT INDIAN HISTORY/ ANCIENT KASHMIR HISTORY)

Credits: Theory-04, Tutorial: 02

Objectives/ Expected Learning Outcomes:

The course deals with the remote past of Indian subcontinent. The course deals with the history and archaeology of Indian subcontinent from stone ages up to the beginning of early medieval times. The learner will be acquainted with the various stone-age cultures, civilizations, chiefdoms, kingdoms and empires that flourished in the Indian subcontinent. It focuses on the achievements especially in the field of polity, economy and culture. The paper aims at enabling the students to understand the origin growth and development of different socio-economic and political structures. It also aims at enabling the learners to understand the regional history in the broader context of Indian sub-continent.

The students are expected:

- *a.* To understand the significance of various categories of sources in the construction and reconstruction of past.
- b. To understand the origin, growth and development of various cultures in Indian subcontinent.
- *c.* To appreciate the importance of various processes of interaction and accommodation in the making of Indian plural culture.

- e. To understand and appreciate the role of history in inculcating human values.
- *f.* To appreciate the value of heritage.
- g. To acquaint the students with regional heritage.
